**St Johns Ambulance First Aid Course** Over October half term sixty of our Bronze, Silver and Gold students came in over 3 days to complete their St Johns First Aid Certificate as part of their Award.

Caroline from St John's delivered the course to twenty students on the Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. They were long days with a lot of information to take on board. The course ranged from practical to theory and required participation in all aspects of the syllabus. Students covered CPR, recovery positon, minor



and major bleeds, contacting emergency services and many other topics.

A very worthwhile course which students found incredibly useful. We have one more day of first aid training happening during the Friday of February half term for students who missed out this time.

Staff First Aid and Lowland Leader training Well done to Miss Crookes and Mrs VSJ for successfully completed their 16 hour Outdoor Incident Management Course on Saturday 16h and Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> November. This course covered many first aid incidents but provided instruction on how to deal with these incidents in a remote environment. This meant a lot of time spent outside in the rain, wind and cold to be assessed in many of the scenarios.

On Saturday the 23<sup>rd</sup> and Sunday the 24<sup>th</sup> of November Miss Whittaker and Miss Enright spent the weekend at Nell Bank in Ilkley taking part in the Mountain Training Lowland Leader Training delivered by the North of England Duke of Edinburgh team. They were put through their paces on grid references, signs and symbols, appropriate kit, weather forecasts and navigation on both days. We

are very pleased to say they both did fantastic and are working towards their assessment early next year. Well done to all the staff involved and for giving up your weekend to undertake this very important training.
