Year 11 Mocks

The recent mocks gave our Year 11 students the opportunity to begin to prepare for their end of year exams. Their conduct during the mocks was exemplary and I am hopeful that they have learnt the value of early revision. I would urge all parents and carers of Year 11 students to continue to encourage a consistent approach to their studies, by ensuring that students attend school 100% of the time, attend all enrichment sessions on offer, complete their homework and have a regular planned programme of revision as we move towards their final 15 weeks of school. In January, we will be holding our next parent support revision evening, where you can find out how to support your child in the final weeks before exams. Behaviour and Attendance

Thank you to all families for their support as we continue to raise standards at Appleton – particularly with regard to our high expectations regarding behaviour and ensuring students are safe, respectful and being their best at all times. As testament to their hard work so far this term, 350 of our students have achieved their Bronze badge for reaching 1000 Excellence Points; 223 have achieved their silver badge (2000 points); 56 have achieved their gold badge (3000 points) and 3 have already achieved their Platinum badge.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that all students should have their planner every day as this is a vital way of ensuring students are organised, as well as a key way for you to find out how your child is doing in school. We record excellence points, attendance, behaviour issues, homework and any other notices in the planner. School uniform is a crucial way we make a statement about the importance of learning and pride in our student's achievements so your continued support with this is also greatly appreciated. Can I remind you that our uniform stipulates grey trousers and formal shoes and we would ask you to support us in ensuring that students have the correct uniform on their return from the Christmas break.

Attendance and punctuality continues to be a priority and I would like to remind you that next half term we are running an attendance challenge that is open to everyone – the 'New Year, New Start' initiative. We are looking for as many students as possible to achieve at least 96% attendance (or over) in the 6 weeks of next half term. For those that do, they will be eligible for entry into a prize draw, with students who have achieved 100% attendance being able to win a £100 shopping voucher (one prize per year group) and those with 96% attendance (equivalent to one day of absence) eligible to win a £25 shopping voucher (two prizes per year group).





We hope you will back this initiative by encouraging your child to attend school regularly and on time. We also really appreciate parental support in making medical appointments outside of school time wherever possible. Unless your child has a serious illness or it is recommended that they are absent (as was the case with the recent outbreak of norovirus), please send them in to school and we will look after them, contacting you if necessary.

I will also be consulting with parents about starting a 'parent forum' once per term. More details on both of these initiatives will follow early in the Spring Term.
