Being Your Best



The majority of our pupils behave very well however, if they are not following our expectations, they will receive behaviour points and sanctions but

74% of this year's Year 7 have less than 50 behaviour points for the entire year! That's less than 2 behaviour points per week!

Academy Expectations: Phones



Government ministers have urged schools to ban phones, this has been backed by OfSTED

Our stance

 Phones – <u>zero tolerance</u> approach to phones and earphones inside the building including break times, in corridors, all lessons and on the way out of the building

Confiscation: no arguments, no discussion – must be collected by parents

Please help us by not calling or messaging your children during the school day- call the office instead.

Academy Expectations: Shoes



Our uniform is black, lace up formal shoes for boys and smart black polishable shoes for girls. They must be formal shoes not leisure shoes, trainers or boots. Please support us by buying the right footwear at the beginning of the year.

Any student wearing inappropriate footwear must change into shoes we provide and will have a supervised lunch. Regardless of whether a parent writes a note.

We decide if they are acceptable – Vans, Converse etc are not formal shoes.

Academy Expectations: Shoes



* they are trainers if we say they are!

- Do not buy VANS, converse, Nike or any other brand of leisure wear just because they are black or leather. <u>They are not</u> <u>acceptable</u>.
- Even if Asda tells you they are 'Back to School' shoes, if they are not formal black shoes they are not acceptable.
- It isn't worth trying to challenge this as your child will have to take the consequence of supervised lunch or removal from circulation.
- Medical conditions you must submit a letter from a consultant explaining why formal shoes cannot be worn.

Essential uniform to be worn at all times:

- Charcoal grey trousers *
- White shirt
- Appleton Academy blazer and tie
- Black Shoes

*they must be loose fitting not jeggings, leggings, or tight fitting

Don't waste your money buying a jumper – students still have to wear a blazer.



Academy Expectations



Incorrect uniform is rarely an issue now.

You will hear your children say 'everyone else is...'

- This will not be the case but please feel free to call and ask the Head of Year.
- Your child will ask you to write a note excusing uniform, please be aware that we might not accept your note. In the case of shoes, we will expect your child to wear shoes provided by the academy.
- Piercings, long nails and nail varnish are not acceptable.

Academy Expectations: Planners



Planners are essential equipment as they are the first line of communication between home and school.

- We record: attendance, behaviour , Excellence points, independent work, important dates and detentions.
- Students have to show their planner on entry to the building in a morning, it is on desks in classrooms and is used for entry into the dining room at lunch.
- Please help us by checking the planner every day and signing it at the end of each week.

Attendance and Punctuality

- 96%+ attendance is acceptable
- Less than 96% is unacceptable
- 90% or less is Persistent Absence and neglect
- Holidays are not approved and we will issue fines
- Your child must be on time each day or will attend a late detention.
