Dear Parent/Carer

As we approach the end of our first half term, I thought it would be a good opportunity to share some of the highlights of the year to date, as well as providing some reminders and information about upcoming events in the busy run up to Christmas.

Our New Students

It has been our pleasure to welcome new students into Year 7. We are really pleased with how well they have settled into our school. It has also been lovely to see our older students being such excellent role models and supporting our new students to find their way around, as well as facilitating some of our extra-curricular activities. After half term, the Year 7 Team will be hosting a drop in homework club each Tuesday evening to support students. Year 6 Choices Evening

It was fantastic to see so many prospective students for September 2025 and their parents at our choices evening, which was held this month. Feedback from the evening was excellent, with some wonderful comments about our staff and students. Thank you to all of our current students who supported these events and made them so successful, they were a credit to parents and the school.

Enrichment

Our lunchtime and enrichment programme is now well underway. We have had over 20 clubs taking place this half term, with students enjoying a wide range of options including mountain biking, singing, and drama, among many other exciting activities. We would encourage students to play a full and active part in life at Appleton and enjoy everything we have to offer. Our timetable can be found on the website and sign up for clubs taking place in the next half term will start during the first week back at school.

Careers Events

We are delighted to be continuing our Careers Programme for all year groups, with a particular focus this half term on Year 11 and their next steps. We have hosted visits in school with a number of Sixth Form and College providers coming in to speak to our students about what they can offer. We also held a mock results day and a revision workshop event for students, which was followed by a careers fair for students and parents at which a host of providers were in attendance and was well received by parents and students. A number of our Year 11 students went to visit Solenis, the local manufacturing company, to find out what they do and how they support job opportunities within the local community. Our art students have been exploring their sketching skills with our artist in residence, Chris Mould, and our writers have been working with our writer in residence, Nik Perring, to develop their creative writing. In form time, all year groups have also been learning about a range of different careers.







Uniform

Thank you for your support in ensuring that our uniform standards remain high. The overwhelming majority of our students look very smart and are a credit to you and the school. Unfortunately, we still have a small number of students who do not meet our uniform standards. Please can we remind you that hoodies and non-school jumpers are not permitted. Blazers are a mandatory item of uniform and the expectation is that these are worn at all times, unless otherwise directed by staff. Where students do not comply with our expectations, we will continue to impose sanctions, which will escalate if non-compliance persists. As the cold weather arrives, it is important that students bring a coat to school as they will spend some of their break and lunchtime outside.

Mobile Phones

We would like to remind you that we have a policy of not allowing pupils to use their mobile phone at any time within the school building. Unfortunately, the issue of mobile phone use became a growing problem during the last academic year and continues to cause problems in the new term for a minority of students. Increasingly, schools are moving to systems that involve pupils handing in their phone at the start of the day before collecting them as they leave after school has finished. We would seek to avoid this at all costs, but we need to work together with parents and students to prevent us having to implement something similar at Appleton.

The expectation is that young people leave their phone in their pocket or bag all day, keeping it on silent or powered off. If they do not do so, their phone will be confiscated and can only be collected at the end of the day by a parent. We will be rigorously enforcing this expectation during this academic year and we are asking you to support this. All too often, parents call their child or accept a call from their child during the school day and this is not helpful. Please do not contact your child on their mobile phone during school hours and be respectful of staff who implement our rules. It is totally unnecessary to contact your child, as you can use the contact details on our website if you need to get a message to your child. We have included more avenues to do so this year due to how busy our phone lines can be, which includes emailing info@appletonacademy.co.uk in the first instance, as this email address will be permanently monitored before, during and immediately after the end of the school day. We have also improved the systems in our admin office for call management, which means staff are now able to answer more calls.

If you call your child, or take a call from them during school hours, this then adds to the problems we have in school with use of phones and may mean that children face additional sanctions if they are caught using their phone. Thank you in advance for your support with this.

Attendance

Improving attendance is continuing to be a significant priority for us, as there are still too many children with poor and intermittent school attendance. Regular school attendance is essential for your children if they are to maintain and develop their friendship groups, and to leave school with good qualifications. It is unfortunately the case that if your child is not in school, they struggle to keep up with friendships when they return, which often leads to social problems. Poor attendance is a common factor in every case where parents raise concerns about their child and their social times and relationships. Please read the guidance on our website around attendance and support us in ensuring that your child attends school regularly and on time.







Catering

It is lovely to see so many of our students choosing to eat with us at break and lunch time. Please remember that students can access free chilled water in our dining room and we encourage students to bring a refillable bottle with them. As the cold weather arrives, please remind students to bring coats as some of their lunchtime will be spent outside.
