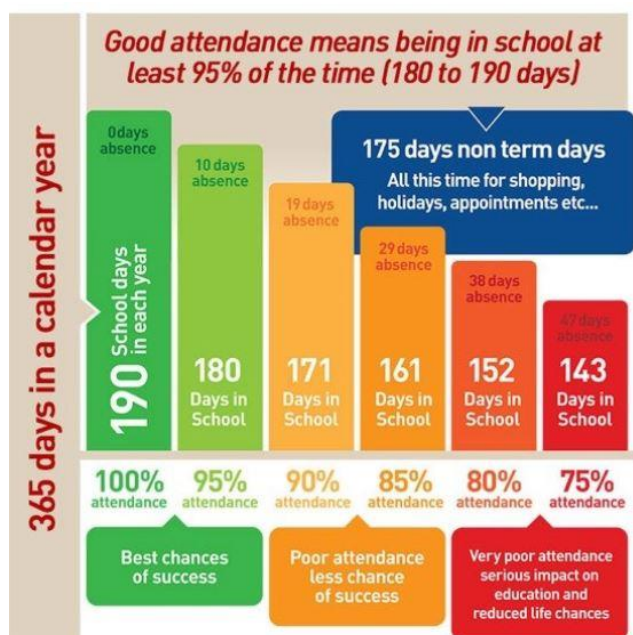


Attendance

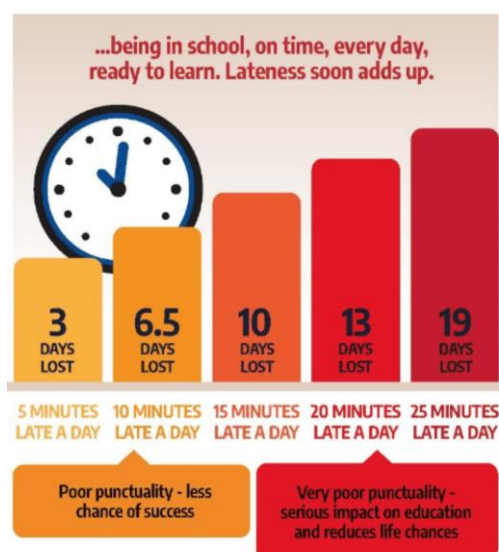

DID YOU KNOW? A child who is 15 minutes late each day, will have missed a full 2 weeks of school in one year.





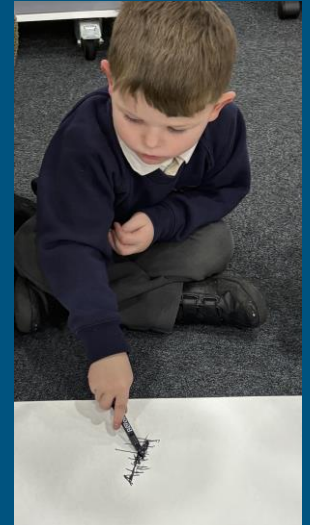

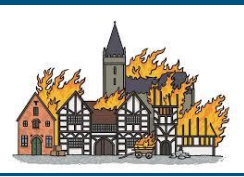


This half term our topic has been D is for Dark, and we have enjoyed exploring lots of different things related to the dark. We have all explored the story of Funny Bones and looked at lots of different light sources. We have learnt about animals that come out at night and created some chalk shadow art! Nursery enjoyed exploring space and pretending to be real astronauts on a mission! The children practised their cutting skills to create space scenes and painted the planets they saw on their journey .

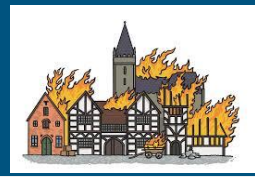

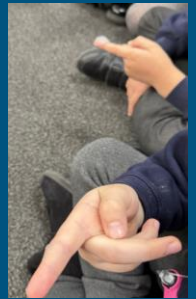




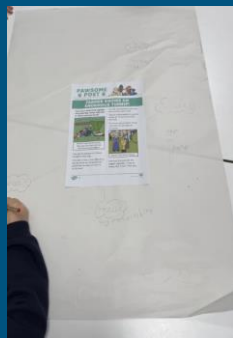
KS1



This half term we have been exploring materials in our science lessons. The children carried out an exciting investigation using bubbles, observing what happens to them over time. We explored whether bubbles became bigger, smaller, or stayed the same, and discussed what this can tell us about different materials.



Our topic has been 'The Great Fire of London' and in English we have been creating reports on this event. We have learnt how journalists answer key questions: who, what, when, where, why and how. The children have enjoyed identifying these features in real reports and using them in their own writing.



In art, we explored the Great Fire of London. The children worked together to create a dramatic scene with flames, the river, and houses, combining their pieces into one vibrant collaborative artwork.





Year 3



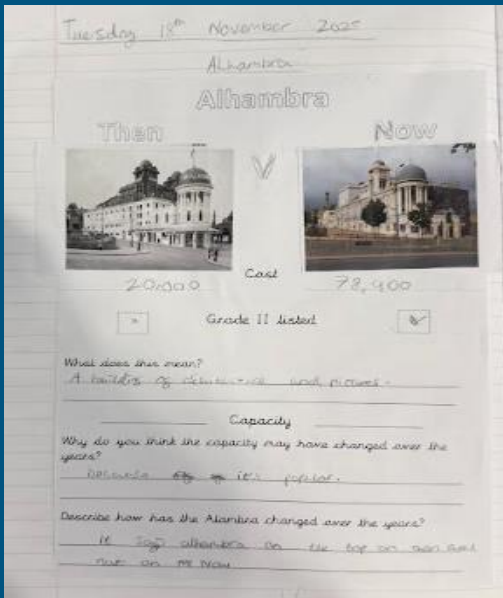

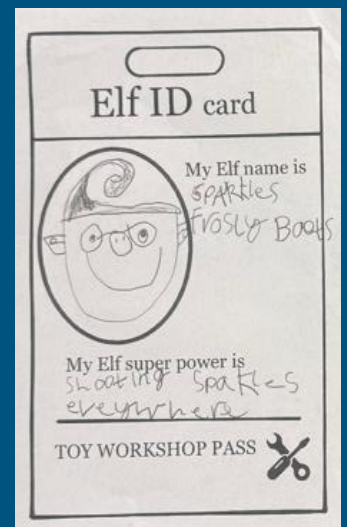
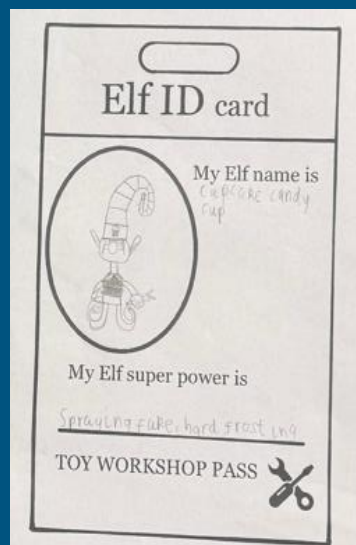

To develop teamwork and resilience, 4MA and 4IA completed sessions with 'Commando Joe' to work together and overcome the challenges set.



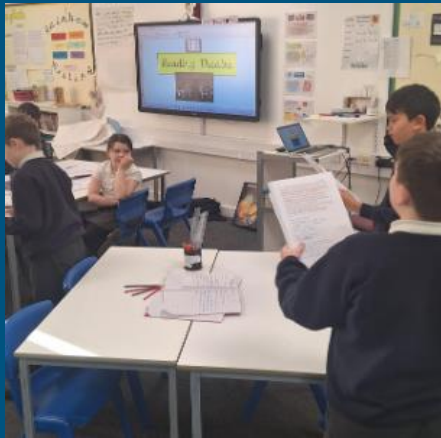
Year 4 have worked with Chris Mould as our author in residence to create Elf badges.

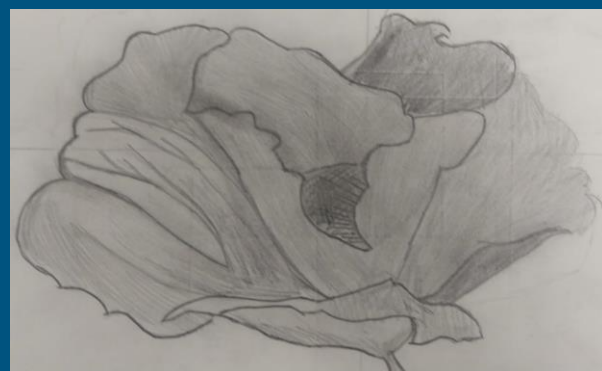
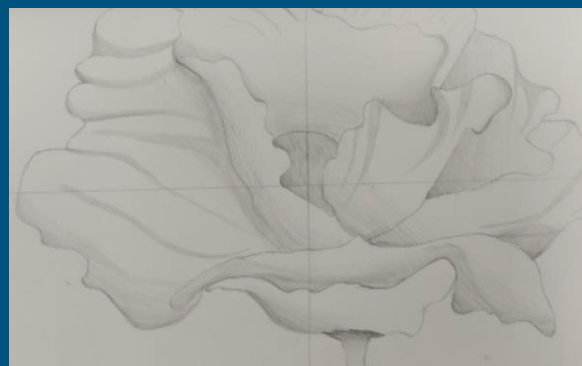
Year 6



This half term in history we have been focussing on World War One and the impact this had on the world and our lives today. We wrote some amazing poetry.



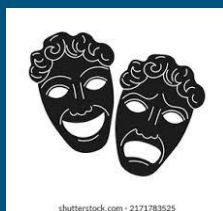
In our art session we have created poppies using a range of different mediums.

We also had great fun at the Christmas disco.



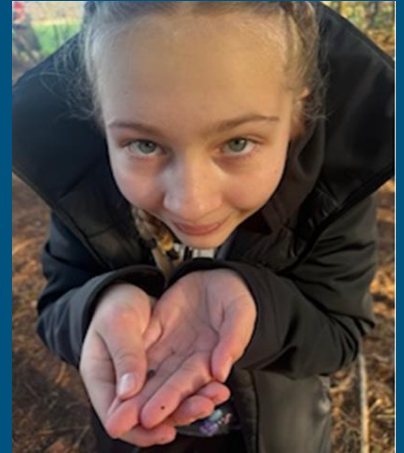
An amazing time was had by all on our residential and a massive thank you to all the staff who supported on this.

Year 3 attended a golf tournament against various school across Bradford. They took part in activities where they had to put and chip the golf ball.



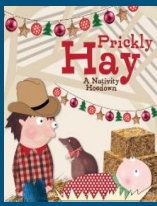

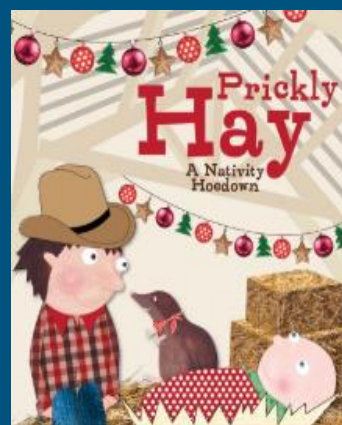
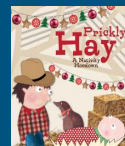
The KS1 Christmas production of 'Prickly Hay' was a joyful and lively performance. The children learned songs and explored expression, movement and staging as they brought the story to life.

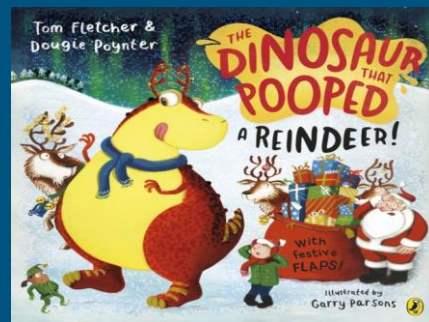


Library Events

Children have enjoyed playing during our games club sessions.

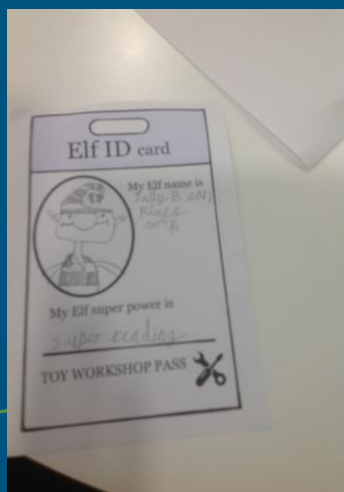
