In support of our Year 8 Scholars, we are organising an educational visit to Wilberforce House Museum in Hull on Wednesday 25 February 2026. Wilberforce House is the birthplace of William Wilberforce, Hull's renowned anti-slavery campaigner. Now a historic museum, its galleries explore the realities of the transatlantic slave trade and its lasting legacies. This visit provides a valuable opportunity for our Scholars, who have been reading Noughts and Crosses by Malorie Blackman - a novel that explores an alternative universe in which racial roles are reversed.

During the day, students will also visit the Streetlife Museum and the Hull and East Riding Museum of Archaeology, allowing them to further explore the history and culture of the city of Hull.

There is no cost to you for the visit. A packed lunch will be provided by the Academy to all students who receive free school meals. Please provide details of any dietary requirements via the link below. If your child does not receive free school meals, please provide a packed lunch.

Students may wear appropriate non-uniform for the visit. Please be aware that if any attire is deemed inappropriate, students will not be allowed to attend the visit.
